

DIDGERIDOO

This great activity makes use of lunch wrap rolls or plastic tubing to make a didgeridoo.

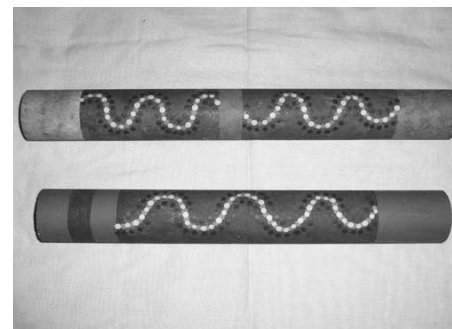
Made in tandem with the clap sticks, once completed your children will be decked out ready to make music!

The didgeridoo is an instrument played by males.



Paint the lunch wrap roll or plastic tube brown and let dry.

Then paint the ends or the middle a different colour and let dry.



Finish off by decorating the roll. Use stripes or dots as shown in the photo.



Boys can play the didgeridoo by blowing into it to make a sound.

To create music, boys and girls can play didgeridoo and clap sticks together.

WHAT YOU NEED

- Lunch wrap rolls or plastic tubing
- Paints
- Cotton buds or thin sticks
- Paint brushes
- Egg carton to put the paint in
